Interestingly, many believe that west-facing homes are inauspicious, but that's not true. This is because the Sun rises in the east, and it is obvious that the west is a bad direction for a home to face.

Regardless of that statement being true or false, you can't ignore west facing House in Vastu Shastra principles if you're getting your house built or renovated. There's more to that.

What is Meant by West Facing House in Vastu Shastra?

A west facing house Vastu generally means a house in which the main entrance points toward the west direction. To identify it, stand inside your house facing the main door. If you look toward the west while doing so, your home is considered west-facing.

People often use the sun's position to determine directions, just like in east-facing homes. However, due to the Earth's 23.5-degree tilt, the sun's path slightly shifts, making it important to confirm the direction accurately using a compass or Vastu-approved tools.

West Facing House Vastu Tips You Should Follow

A west-facing home often gets misunderstood, but in truth, it carries the calming strength of the setting sun. Ruled by Lord Varuna (the God of water), this direction represents stability, fulfillment, and emotional depth.

When designed as per West Facing House Vastu principles, it can invite lasting success, balance, and peaceful, content energy into your life. Here are some tips you need to follow:

Entrance or Main Door

Place the main door between the 3rd to 6th pada on the west wall, counted from the northwest corner. Also, you must keep the entrance bright, open, and uncluttered to attract positive energy. Moreover, add a threshold or step-up for balance and avoid heavy décor directly facing the door.

Bedroom

The southwest corner is ideal for the master bedroom, as it ensures restful sleep, stability, and confidence. Make sure to keep the head towards the south or east, and decorate the space in calm, earthy colors for grounding energy.

Kitchen

The southeast corner is the best spot for the kitchen, aligning with the fire element. If that's unavailable, choose the northwest corner. While cooking, face east in a southeast kitchen or west in a northwest one. Ensure proper ventilation, brightness, and clutter-free counters for flow.

Bathroom

Locate bathrooms in the northwest or west zones for smooth energy and drainage. Avoid the northeast and southwest corners. Keep the space well-lit, dry, and properly ventilated. Adding light colors like white or beige enhances cleanliness and prevents heaviness in this area.

Pooja Room

Place the pooja or meditation space in the northeast for divine vibrations. If not possible, the east or north directions work well. Face east while praying, and maintain a simple, peaceful setup with soft light and natural incense to attract positive spiritual energy.

Kids' Bedroom

The northwest direction suits kids best, as it supports learning, independence, and healthy routines. Keep the room airy and filled with natural light. Use cheerful yet soft colors to enhance concentration and calmness. Avoid clutter to maintain focus and steady growth.

Staircase

For west-facing homes, build the staircase in the south, southwest, or west part of the house. Always ensure it moves clockwise as you go up. Avoid placing it in the northeast or center, as that can block light and energy flow.

Colors

Choose warm neutrals like cream, beige, and soft yellow to complement the golden glow of the evening sun. Add touches of green or pastel tones for freshness. Avoid very dark shades; instead, go for light, balanced hues that help create a soothing and welcoming atmosphere.

Dos and Don'ts for West Facing House in Vastu Shastra

Every home radiates a certain energy, and a west-facing one is no exception. The key lies in aligning its layout with natural balance and letting the evening light bring warmth without overpowering the home. How can you make sure of that? By following these simple Vastu dos and don'ts:

Dos As Per West Facing House in Vastu Shastra

- Use a satellite compass to identify the true west direction instead of relying on the sunset.
- Place your main entrance in the Sugriva or Pushpdanta padas, as these are the most auspicious zones.
- In a multi-storey home, position the master bedroom in the southwest corner, preferably on the topmost floor.
- Set up your kitchen in the southeast corner for best results; if unavailable, the northwest zone is also suitable.
- If your plot is sloped, ensure it slopes from south to north or northeast to maintain natural energy balance.
- Keep the south and west walls slightly thicker and higher than the north and east ones to strengthen stability.
- Add more windows on the north and east sides to enhance natural light and airflow.
- Always follow proper Vastu layout alignment for rooms and entrances, and seek professional advice when in doubt.
- Before finalizing or purchasing a property, consider a Vastu consultation to evaluate orientation, slope, and overall design.

Don'ts As Per West Facing House in Vastu Shastra

- Avoid determining your home's direction based on the sunset, as it can be inaccurate.
- Don't place the main door in inauspicious zones such as Pitra, Duavrik, Asur, or Shosha padas.
- Avoid keeping the kitchen in the northeast corner, as it conflicts with the fire element.
- Never choose a property with a slope from north to south, as it disrupts the natural energy flow.
- Don't build extensions or projections toward the south or southeast directions.
- Avoid homes with trees, electric poles, or walls directly in front of the main entrance.
- Don't make the south and west boundaries thinner or weaker than the north and east sides.

- In multi-storey homes, avoid placing the kitchen directly above or below a bathroom, master bedroom, or pooja room.
- Refrain from building staircases in the northeast or north zones, as they can restrict positive energy circulation.
